Eschatology - what is it?

- 1. From the Greek word *eschatos* (ἔσχατος) which means "last"
- 2. Eschatology is the study of last things

How NOT to approach the end times

1. Trying to predict the date of Christ's return (SLIDES)

 - a. 1 Thessalonians 4:15-18

- c. "Rapture" is derived from Middle French *rapture*, via the Medieval Latin *raptura* ("seizure, kidnapping"), which derives from the Latin *raptus* ("a carrying off"). (Wikipedia, "Rapture")
- 2. Tribulation
 - a. Matthew 24:15-31
 - b. See curriculum questions
- 3. Millennium

a. Revelation 20:1-10

- c. "Millennium" is derived from the Latin *mille*, thousand, and *annus*, year. (Wikipedia, "Millennium")
- 4. We don't know when Christ will return
 - a. Matthew 24:44
 - b. Matthew 25:13

 - d. Revelation 22:20
- 5. Jesus will return in bodily form
 - a. Acts 1:10-11
