Observation and exposition

- 1. Read the passage [SLIDES]
- 2. Observation and exposition
 - a. The time and setting [SLIDES]
 - i. Distances
 - 1. Stott approximately 100 miles from Philippi to Thessalonica
 - Peterson 30 miles from Philippi to Amphipolis, 27 miles from Amphipolis to Apollonia, and 35 miles from Apollonia to Thessalonica
 - ii. Thessalonica
 - 1. The capital and principal city of the province of Macedonia
 - 2. Founded in 315 B.C.
 - 3. A harbor town and on the Via Egnatia
 - iii. Questions
 - 1. How long were Paul and team in Thessalonica?
 - a. At least a few weeks, probably a few months
 - 2. Where and when were 1 and 2 Thessalonians written?
 - a. Possibly Athens, more likely Corinth
 - b. Shortly after leaving Thessalonica
 - b. Paul preaches (reasons) in the synagogue (1-3)
 - i. His message content
 - 1. The Christ (Messiah) had to suffer (die) and rise from the dead
 - 2. Jesus his life, ministry, death, resurrection
 - 3. Jesus is the Christ
 - His message method
 - 1. "he reasoned with them from the Scriptures"
 - 2. Other examples in Acts
 - a. 17:11-13
 - b. 18:5, 9-11

- c. 19:8-10
- 3. Compare what Jesus did in Luke 24:25-27, 44-47
- 4. "Knowing the Bible is not the same thing as knowing Jesus."
 - a. Knowing Jesus is absolutely essential John 17:3
 - b. But, can we know Jesus without or apart from knowing the Bible? Discuss.
- c. The reaction to Paul's message (4-5)
 - i. Some believed (4)
 - 1. Some of the Jews
 - 2. A great many devout Greeks (Gentiles)
 - 3. Not a few of the leading women (of the city?)
 - 4. And "joined Paul and Silas"
 - a. What does this mean?
 - ii. Some Jews did not believe, and were jealous (5)
 - 1. What did they do?
 - a. Hired some wicked men
 - b. Formed a mob
 - c. Set the city in an uproar (started rumors?)
 - d. Attacked the house of Jason why?
 - i. Paul and team may have been staying there
 - ii. Probably the new church was meeting in Jason's house
 - iii. The accusations by the Jews (6-7)
 - 1. Was there any truth to their accusations?
 - 2. Destroyer of the gods book cover [SLIDE]
 - 3. Christians and government
 - a. Romans 13:1-2
 - b. Philippians 4:20
 - 4. Stott quote [SLIDE]
 - iv. The reaction of the people and the authorities (8-9)
 - 1. They were disturbed, but did not resort to violence, as happened in Philippi and other cities.
 - 2. They required a financial security bond from Jason and the others.

- a. Probably why Paul had to leave immediately.
- d. Read **1 Thessalonians 1:1-3:13** for Paul's perspective on what happened in Thessalonica, answers to some questions raised earlier, and encouragement.
 - i. Imagine you are the newly formed Thessalonian church?
